On November 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>, two teacher delegates - VSTA VP Patrice Davidson (C) and Dave Fritz (S) - represented the Valley Stream CHSD at the NYSTRS annual meeting in Saratoga, here's a recap:

Delegates unanimously elected teachers <u>Sheila Sullivan Buck</u> and <u>Elizabeth Chetney</u> to the Retirement Board. Buck, of Rush-Henrietta Central Schools, was re-elected to a new three-year term as one of the three active teacher members on the Board. Chetney, of Baldwinsville Central School District, was elected to complete the term of Paul J. Farfaglia, who retired from teaching in June.
